


Almost Saved is Wholly Lost






1. Al-most saved you wait-ing stand, Heed-ing not the Lord's com-mand;

4. Al-most saved, how sad 'twill be, When the Mas - ter calls for thee;




At His feet, oh come and bow, He will save you, save you now.
